

Over the next four years MNBC will, as a start, have at least \$25 million to spend on Social Infrastructure in Métis Chartered Communities. ## Do you have a child, kindergarten up to age 12, needing care during school Winter and Spring breaks?

The Métis Winter and Spring Break Supplement will help Métis families with the cost of school break camps. The Winter and Spring Break Supplement will not exceed a maximum of \$500.00 per child per school year. This supplement will support families with the costs of school break camps. These are inclusive of winter and spring break

This funding does not support skills development camps that are improving skills in sport, art, or specific development, and school professional development days or other school closures. This funding will be available to families to assist in their child care needs during Winter and Spring break.

### Before you apply, you will need:

- To be an MNBC Citizen and provide your citizenship number or an have a verified active application with the registry.
