MÉTIS NATION BC MINISTRY OF ELDERS

Métis Elders and Seniors Assistance Program (MESAP) The MESAP will aid lower-income Métis Citizens Elders & Seniors purchase essential to help low-income Elders/Seniors purchase health-related necessities that are not covered by BC Medical Services Plan (MSP). The funds can be used by Elders/Seniors for the purchase of items including hearing aids, dentures, walkers, glasses, and more.

Elders Temporary Financial Support



MNBC Ministry of Elders is assisting our low-income Métis Elders/Senior Citizens whose income has been impacted by COVID-19. The program is to assist Métis Elders/Seniors to obtain groceries, household needs, or medications.

ELIGIBILITY

Must be a registered Métis Nation BC Citizen. Those who have submitted applications for citizenship and are in the process are considered. Low-income Métis Elders/Senior Citizens who are 60 years of age or more who are:

Single/widowed/divorced with an income of \$28,150 or less may qualify up to \$500.

Married/common-law households with a combined income of \$48,432 or less may qualify up to \$750.

The application must demonstrate how COVID-19 has impacted the applicant's income or ability to obtain groceries, household needs, or medications.

A note from the artist:

Contemplation and prayer guided the Baby Moccs design. The central moccasin image was based off of photo of Métis artist, Randi Nelson's childhood moccasins. I placed them over the moon as a reminder that Indigenous children were especially vulnerable and unsafe at night and many used the cover of darkness to try to escape. Grandmother moon is also a powerful source of friendship, wisdom and guidance and I imagine her shining into the beautiful faces of all Indigenous children from the past, present and future. Lastly, I included cedar for its strength and purifying properties.
